



WHEN BLOOD TRIBE MEMBERS SHOULD BE VACCINATED

Vaccine	Adult and Youth Availability
Influenza and Moderna COVID-19 vaccines	6 months & older Vaccines are provided seasonally, or as recommended. You are also eligible if you have no previous doses of COVID-19 vaccine, there is a 3-month spacing between doses.
Pneumococcal vaccine	All Ages Students & community members qualify for the new PneuC20 vaccine which protects against 20 different strains of Pneumonia
Tetanus, pertussis, and diphtheria vaccine	Grade 9; and a booster at least every 10 years; and a booster with each pregnancy
Measles, mumps, rubella vaccine	Adults born after 1970 or health care workers of any age
Varicella vaccine	Age 13+ without a history of chicken pox disease or immunization
Polio vaccine	All ages, if no previous history of polio immunization. Age 18+ booster for some high risk individuals and occupations.
Quadrivalent meningitis vaccine	Grade 9 (Available until the end of grade 12)
Human Papiloma Virus (HPV) vaccine	Grade 6 (Available until age 26)
Hepatitis B vaccine	Grade 6 (Available until end of grade 12) Individuals born in 1981 or later who were eligible for school vaccine but did not get immunized)
